***** IMPORTANT**—You will need to provide all equipment and food, except the **Saturday evening** You may want Saturday's lunch to be a sack lunch as there is no designated lunch break. Most event venues will involve some waiting; use the time. *******

The event site is a reclaimed strip mine. Potable water will be available on site. Ground fires are acceptable, please observe all fire safety guidelines. **Firewood will be provided**. It will be in piles scattered throughout the camping area. Even if the pile is "in your campsite" it is **not yours exclusively**. There is always a lot more than we use. Share, cooperate. Completely extinguish any fires. Fire stands may be emptied in the grass along the edge of the camping area. Completely extinguish any ground fires and scatter the ashes.

The Coal Camporee will be one of the most exciting and fun events you will attend this year. Registration will be done by unit, but you may register individually if your unit isn't attending. Preregistration of ALL participants is expected, youth and adult. It makes check in much faster for you, otherwise you will have to provide a detailed list of attendees as part of check in.

- Your specific camping area will be assigned to you when you arrive. There are typically 35 or so units represented. Your area will be a general space to be used by more than one unit. Do not waste space. Cooperate. Talk to one another.
- There will be **no vehicles in campsites**; use the designated parking area. We prefer that trailers be dropped in campsite and the towing vehicle go to a parking area. Vehicles take up much needed camping space, block access within the campsites, are a hazard in themselves, and violate BSA guidelines. Follow directions. We suggest you use as few vehicles as possible; car pool.
- You should arrive as early as is possible Friday evening. We realize a good many people come considerable distance so there will be arrivals very late in the evening. There will be floodlights around the campground until 11:00 PM or so. There is no formal program. Units should check in and set up camp.
- **There will be a brief orientation Friday evening at 10:00 PM. Send at least one adult leader and senior youth camper. There will likely be a handout explaining Saturday's events. Actual unit round robin schedules will be passed out at the meeting Saturday morning. Unit schedules cannot be assigned until we receive complete attendance information.**
- There are "extra" activities beyond those listed on your schedule. Use waiting time to visit them as you choose. Do not overload a session; come back later.
- Saturday activities start with a flag ceremony at 7:30 AM. Immediately following this there will be a more specific orientation about the day's activities and a mandatory safety briefing. At the end of this meeting the unit round robin schedule for the day will be distributed. **FOLLOW YOUR SCHEDULE.**
- There will be a campfire program that evening. You are encouraged to participate with a skit or song.
- There will be a Scout's Own Service Sunday morning. If anyone would like to be part of that please contact Gerry Gevedon. Attendance is voluntary. You may leave at whatever time you wish, but ask that you leave before noon.
- **CARRY OUT YOUR TRASH.**
- It is elk hunting season. DO NOT LEAVE THE CAMPSITE AREA. Alert staff to any hunters you see.
- If you have completed the on line portion of the Kentucky Hunter Education Course, bring your certification of completion. There will be KDFW representative(s) on site that will approve your shooting experience to complete the course.
- If you are interested in becoming an NRA RSO or Instructor, or a USA Archery Level 1 Instructor there will be a signup sheet at the registration tent. Talk to one of the range operators if you need more information.
- **HELP! HELP! HELP!** We especially need help with parking Friday evening, through to as late as 11:00 PM. Even if you do not have training credentials you can still help in the ranges or with an event. BE A SCOUT. A SCOUT IS HELPFUL. VOLUNTEER.
